Associate Professor Department of Criminal Justice – Governors State University, Chicago

Joao Salm is Associate Professor in the Department of Criminal Justice at Governors State University, Chicago. He taught at Simon Fraser University and at the University of Alberta in Canada. He led and co-founded, together with Professor Elizabeth Elliott, Brazilian judges and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Canada, the international cooperation between Canada and Brazil in Restorative Justice. He has been a consultant to the United Nations Peacebuilding Fund for Restorative Justice in Guinea Bissau (Africa), to the UNDP in Fiji and Solomon Islands (South Pacific), to the Supreme Court of Brazil and The Brazilian National Council of Justice. In 2016 he coedited the book Citizenship, Restorative Justice and the Environment - A dialogue between Brazil, the United States, Canada, Spain and Italy. He also co-authored several articles and book chapters, among them: Examining the principles and practices of restorative justice as an integrative process, in M. Stout (Ed.), The future of progressivism: Applying Follettian thinking to contemporary issues and Revisiting the Governing Paradoxes of Restorative Justice: A Comparative Critical Discourse Analysis of the Ibero-American and Belgian Declarations on Juvenile Restorative Justice.
